
Nutritional Counseling in WIC

Restart *Babies First* Home Visiting

Public health home visiting nurses help families to create a safer and more nurturing home environment, which can significantly increase young children's readiness for school, and likelihood of later success in life. For example:

- Parents learn skills, and positive ways to interact with children;
- Parents learn about and address in-home risks to health and safety;
- Children are screened for early signs of a disability and nurses arrange for appropriate action;
- Parents are connected with community resources for food, employment, housing, transportation, education, or other assistance.
