Purses *for* **Nurses!**

A Fundraiser for Family Health Services

Purses for Nurses 2015, our 6th annual fundraising event, surpassed our expectations this year, netting \$15,000 !! On October 17th, over 100 women outbid each other for 52 purses filled with donations of gift certificates and merchandise from area businesses, organizations, and individuals. The auction alone raised \$7,695, and over \$2,000 in cash donations were given by individual members and guests! Our emcee, Stephanie Kilmer (K-Dock Radio), kept the music and action in sync throughout the event. The program included messages from Lindi Quinn, our CCFoPH President, and Florence Pourtal-Stevens, the Public Health Administrator, plus entertainment from two Bay Area Teen Idol contest-

ants, who thrilled us with their songs.

We consider the event wildly successful, primarily due to the money raised which goes to support services for families through Coos Health & Wellness, and secondarily, yet not to be underestimated, because it was a fun time for women, supporting a good cause!

Renee' Menkens, our long-time Board

Secretary and current Vice President, has received a prestigious award: **Culture of Health: Breakthrough Leaders in Nursing.** Renee' is one of 10 Breakthrough Leaders in the nation receiving this award, which is supported by The AARP and Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Those receiving this award are Registered Nurses who are working to make sure that all in our diverse society will live healthier lives – now and for our future generations. Renee' has been involved as the Friends liaison to the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) subcommittees



on Access to Health Care Providers and Healthy Eating, Active Lives. She is a strong advocate for nursing as well as improving the health of our county residents. She was nominated for this award by the Oregon Action Coalition, a statewide coalition of nursing and other organizations, focused on improving health care and advancing the nursing profession. In addition, our Coos Health and Wellness Public Health Director, Florence Pourtal-Stevens, supported Renee's nomination because of her involvement in the CHIP subcommittees. As Renee' said, "It is an honor to be selected. It is an amazing opportunity to support the important work of the CHIP in our county. Being part of this leadership group will help me learn more on about being a leader to improve the health of our county residents." Renee traveled to Washington D.C. in early December to receive the award, meet the other nine "Breakthrough Leaders", and learn how to be more effective in supporting health for our county and advancing nursing as a leader in health care.

Zonta Grants Serve Women in Need

Coos Health and Wellness (CH&W) reported in December that **38 women**, who were in financial need and ranging in ages from 18 to 76 years, **were served with the Zonta Community Grant award** during the calendar year, 2015. CCFoPH was the recipient of the \$2500 Zonta grant that provided health vouchers at CH&W for services such as family planning, pregnancy tests, breast and pelvic annual exams, immunizations, and treatment for sexually transmitted infections. The value of the vouchers provided by the Zonta grant ranged from \$10.35 for a lab test, to \$188 for a full exam with multiple labs.

AND, there's more good news! CCFoPH was awarded a grant for \$3500, which will serve even more women through Coos Health & Wellness during 2016. Board members Jenny Bream, Jeanne Moore, and Mike Claassen attended the awards luncheon to accept the check on December 18th. The Zonta Club of the Coos Bay Area raises funds for community grants and scholarships through its annual Celebrity Dinner, which is scheduled this year on February 20th. Thank you, Zonta, for assisting low income women in Coos County with their health care needs!
