Our health department is a key frontline to services for many women and their families for family planning, parenting classes, WIC services and immunizations.

Among other degrees, Florence graduated with a Master's in Public Health from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. Florence has many years of experience in health care program management and administration. She worked specifically on programs focusing on prevention and treatment of STDs, access to primary health care services, early childhood development, and provision of emergency medical services to underserved populations in Africa and Asia. She married a Coos County native in 2011, and has lived in the county on -and-off again since 2008.

#### New AmeriCorps VISTA Volunteer at CCPH By Nicole Bowman

Nicole Bowman is an AmeriCorps VISTA volunteer who has begun her year working with the Coos County Public Health Department. She is working on several projects, including a survey that she is promoting to all residents of Coos County.

Coos County Public Health would like to identify barriers, both actual and perceived, for those in the community who are not accessing available public health services. The survey will help Coos County Public Health understand why people may not be coming in. Reasons may include lack of awareness of the services available, lack of transportation, lack of insurance coverage, distrust, etc. The information gathered from the surveys will be used to mitigate or eliminate these barriers.

Nicole is also working with the Emergency Preparedness Department to implement a countywide project addressing life-critical and psychotropic medications used by Coos County residents. This data will be used to establish an initial request for medications in the event of a disaster. This is an extremely vital project in order to keep our community members on their proper medications, if the normal pharmaceutical supply is breached.

She hopes to work with many of you over the course of her year with Coos County Public Health.
